As the senior staff administrative position within the organization, the President and CEO—reporting to the RPA Board of Trustees through the Chair of the Board—will manage the human and financial resources of the Reno Philharmonic Orchestra and the Reno Philharmonic Association (RPA). The President and CEO will be accountable for all operational aspects of the organization and implementing the policies set by the Board of Trustees. The President and CEO will provide the leadership, vision, and information needed to enable the Board of Trustees to adopt constructive, progressive, sound, and practical plans for the continued development of the organization and the continued enrichment of the musical life of the community. The President and CEO will ensure that the RPA constantly improves its musical product, that it operates on as stable a financial basis as possible, and that it carries out its obligation to serve as a community cultural and educational institution.

The Reno Phil began in 1969, with the first public performance on August 3rd at the Pioneer Center for the Performing Arts, and is northern Nevada's largest performing arts organization with music for all tastes and ages. Finishing its 53rd season, the orchestra, led by Music Director and Conductor Laura Jackson, is a part-time, per-service orchestra composed of over 60 professional musicians who perform annually throughout the Reno, Carson Valley, and Lake Tahoe region. The Reno Phil oversees and operates the professional orchestra, a symphonic chorus, four youth orchestras, and numerous educational and outreach programs—which gained them further recognition for their award-winning and diverse education department. Musicians of the professional orchestra, youth orchestras, various ensembles, and education programs offer more than 60 performances each year—including, Classix, their flagship six-concert series, with guest soloists of local and international acclaim—playing to over 50,000 people, half of them school-aged children. The Reno Phil engages an active Board of Trustees, staff, volunteers, patrons, donors, sponsors, partner organizations, and the community to ensure that it will thrive through future generations. The orchestra operates under a CBA with the American Federation of Musicians.

A bachelor's degree is required for this position as is at least eight years of orchestra, opera or festival experience including leadership experience. Ten years or more of experience is preferred as is familiarity with professional orchestra management and operations.

All applications must be accompanied by a cover letter and resume. Cover letters should be responsive to the mission of Reno Philharmonic Association as well as the responsibilities and qualifications stated in the position prospectus.
