Jessica Bejarano Founder and Music Director San Francisco Philharmonic

Jessica Bejarano is Founder and Music Director of the San Francisco Philharmonic. She also serves as Assistant Conductor of Opera Parallele and Music Director at Escuela Bilingue Internacionale. Jessica was featured on NBC's The Today Show as the

"Woman Breaking Barriers as a Trailblazing Symphony Conductor". PBS NewsHour also featured Jessica as an emerging female conductor and KQED named Jessica one of 10 artists to watch in KQED Arts' Bay Brilliant Top 10 Artists of 2018. Jessica is the first women in history to guest conduct the American Youth Symphony in Los Angeles. She was also the featured guest conductor at the San Diego State University's Women in Music, Diversity and Leadership Conference and was one of twelve female conductors selected from around the world to conduct at the International Women's Conference in New York City. Jessica has guest conducted in Russia, Italy, Romania, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Spain, Venezuela and throughout the United States. Jessica received her Master of Arts in Choral and Orchestral Conducting from the University of California Davis; Bachelor of Music in Music Education from the University of Wyoming, and Associates of Fine Arts in Music Education from Casper College.

My time gave me a wealth of experience and knowledge, allowing me to become an ambassador for HBCUs in China, do humanitarian exchange work in India, and research in Barbados and Trinidad and Tobago. Music has long influenced my thoughts on culture and diversity. I have the experience familiar to most musicians of color in classical music spaces of being the only person of color in the room. I know the feeling, and that experience led me to the work that I currently do with the Inner City Youth Orchestra of Los Angeles (ICYOLA). ICYOLA is nationally recognized for inclusivity in programming and people. I work to provide children from my community access to a wealth of musical knowledge and experiences that might generally be inaccessible to them. I have had the opportunity to pursue higher education and received my Master of Arts in Nonprofit Management, and I am working on a PhD in Leadership and Change.
