Applications are now open for the Anne Parsons Leadership Program, a new initiative from the League of American Orchestras. Honoring Anne Parsons, the transformative orchestra field leader and mentor who passed away in 2022, the pilot program aims to effect structural change by supporting women and non-binary orchestra professionals in their career progressions, and ultimately improving gender equity within the C-suite. Creative Recovery LA Grant Opens Jan 18

Announcing a new Arts and Culture grant in Los Angeles County! Creative Recovery LA is a new grant initiative to address pandemic impacts on the arts and the creative economy, one of the most economically significant and hardest-hit sectors, while leveraging the unique capacity of arts and culture to catalyze our region's economic recovery, civic connectivity, and community wellbeing. Through this initiative the LA Department of Arts and Culture will award over \$26 million in American Rescue Plan funds to deliver financial relief and recovery to the LA County nonprofit arts and culture sector. Grant application workshops will include information about the program, guidelines, eligibility requirements, and tips on submitting strong proposals. They will cover everything nonprofit organizations will need to prepare in order to **apply online when the application is open from January 18-February 15**, **2023**. Three CA Communities Ranked in Top 40 Most Arts-Vibrant Communities of 2022

SMU DataArts has once again released the Arts Vibrancy Index Report in its seventh iteration, celebrating arts-vibrant communities across the United States even as they

grapple with the ongoing realities of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Three California communities were included in the top 40: Los Angeles Metro and San Francisco Metro in the top 20 large communities, and San Rafael in the top 10 medium-sized communities.

According to the report, LA Metro boasts more independent artists and arts, culture, and entertainment firms per capita than any other community in the U.S.; SF Metro boasts the highest levels of per capita program revenue and total compensation paid to those working in arts and culture; and San Rafael scores within the top 1% on arts providers overall.
